# Executive **Order 9066**

- Signed on Feb. 19, 1942
- Japanese Americans • excluded from West Coast
- 125,284 Japanese Americans unjustly incarcerated

#### WESTERN DEFENSE COMMAND AND FOURTH ARMY WARTIME CIVIL CONTROL ADMINISTRATION Presidio of San Francisco, California April 1, 1942 INSTRUCTIONS TO ALL PERSONS OF JAPANESE ANCESTRY

#### Living in the Following Area:

All that portion of the City and County of San Francisco, State of California, lying generally wort of the meth-south line established by Junipero Serra Boulevard, Worehester Assense, and Ninetswath Assense, and bing provally anoth of the cast-west line established by California Street, to the intersection of Market Street, and there on Market Street

All Japanese persons, both alien and non-alien, will be exacuated from the above designated area by 1200 aldock noon Tuesday, April 7, 1942.

No Japanese person will be permitted to enter or leave the above described area after 200 a m. Thursdey, Spei 2, 1912, without obtaining special permission from the Provost Marshal at the Civil Control Station located at

1201 Van New Avenue San Francisco, California

The Civil Control Station is equipped to assist the Japanese population affected by this exacution in the following ways:

1. Give advice and instructions on the exacuation.

2. Provide services with respect to the management, leaving, sale, storage or other disposition of most kinds of property including: real estate, business and professional equipment, buildings, how-hold goods, heats, automobiles, livestock, etc.

3. Provide temporary residence elsewhere for all Japanese in family groups,

4. Transport persons and a limited amount of clothing and equipment to their new residence, as specified below.

#### The Following Instructions Must Be Observed:

1. A responsible member of each family, preferably the head of the family, or the person in whose name most of the property is held, and each individual living alone, will report to the Civil Control Station to reveive further instructions, This must be done between 200 a. m. and 500 p. m., Thursday, April 2, 1982, or between 100 a. m. and 5:00 p.m., Friday, April 3, 1942.

## Forced Removal Economic Loss Cultural Erasure

- 1 2 weeks notice
- Estimated \$4 5 billion lost
- Dismantled:
  - Japan-towns or "Nihonmachis"
  - Religious and cultural institutions
  - Cultural belongings
  - Traditions







## **Minidoka War Relocation Center**

- 33,000 acres located in Jerome, Idaho
- 36 blocks each block had 12 barracks, mess hall, common latrine
- 13,000 Japanese Americans and Native Alaskans incarcerated





## **Exploitation of Labor**


- Minidoka Bureau of Land Reclamation used incarcerees to clear land, build irrigation canals, farm.
- Incarcerees harvested crops for local farmers, some left to work on farm labor camps.




## "Resettlement"







#### Gardens of Healing and Resilience

When I was a child, my father lovingly tended to a beautiful Japanese garden in our backyard. My friends and I tucked flowers in stone lanterns and played hide and seek behind rocks thoughtfully placed in the garden. During quiet times, we serenely watched dragon flies land on the horsetails next to the pond's stone bridge or the tiny toads sitting on the lily pads. The garden seemed to thrive and blossom with the happy chatter of children, while giving back nurturing and healing energy.

With each visit to Minidoka, I stop at the historic rock garden designed by Fujitarō Kubota. A basalt rock "V" pathway leads to the replica Military Honor Roll listing the names of those who served during WWI. A ring of rocks surrounds a large basalt rock, standing tall with blue sky and a wisp of cloud as its backdrop.




#### THE ANNUAL DAY OF REMEMBRANCE

## Legacy

When hecklers circle a north Seattle mosque after 9-11 I won't turn my back in silence knowing vultures will descend on shuttered stores and homes when hate stains holy walls.

Who will stand on granite mosque stairs, link arms with brown brothers and sisters?

I will stand for my mother and father, who sixty years ago could not against US Army bayonets, browning rifles, President Roosevelt and Executive Order 9066. I am like an alien abductee who walks among the living knowing the pain and humiliation of being taken while most white Americans look away.

I have no nightmares about gray creatures with spindly fingers pushing needles into my belly button. My stomach is a chunk of black basalt heavy like a meteorite weight that disappears only when I stand.

With only one lifetime to swing a pick, toss dirt, haul ore, I hoist a lantern in black tunnels, slide my hands to atomic bonds, meld them with stalactites and stalagmites of justice.
